Parade Information Regarding Helmet Use

In Saskatchewan, as a matter of Law, certain restrictions apply to the operation of All Terrain Vehicles even in a parade situation.

While the issue is a bit more complex than I can share here the general rule is:

If the vehicle is designed for off-road use and has tracks of wheels in contact with the ground, it is considered an All-Terrain Vehicle. As such, an approved (DOT, CSA) helmet and eye protection is required. A valid driver's license and a minimum of \$200,000 (CAN\$) liability insurance is also required. Most, if not all, Shrine insurance policies would cover this off.

Certain mini-bikes are also covered but are size dependent. Vehicles like motorbikes, dirt bikes or the like are exempt because they are able to be registered to be driven on-road.

The big thing to keep in mind is the definition; **was this vehicle, regardless of it's current use, originally designed for off-road travel?** If the answer is "Yes" then helmet and goggles, etc. apply.
